HOME AT LAST!

On December 17, 2010, we opened the doors of our new Humane Society of Durham Region. It was an incredibly emotional day; tears of sadness for those we lost and tears of joy for those who will be cared for and loved here for decades to come.

It has been a very difficult and extremely busy two years – meetings, frustrations, joyous moments, sleepless nights, fundraisers, a roller coaster of emotions. All led to this wonderful day!

Many thanks to the staff of Independent Project Managers for helping to organize the event, with special kudos to Leanne Perrier. So many people came out, it was quite chilly but spirits were high. Our families, our friends, our members and the community were all there. Several politicians and representatives also came to show their support including Colin Carrie MP; Mark Holland MP and Kim Glover representing Honourable Jim Flaherty MP. Also there, Joe Dixon MPP, Christine Elliott MPP, Mayors Pat Perkins, John Henry and Adrian Foster; Councillors Amy England; Ken Montague, Michael Emm, Willie Woo, Bob Chapman; Scugog 1st Nation Baagwating Community Association. Your presence and words of encouragement meant a great deal to us.

We thank Dennis O'Connell, John Henry, Amy England and Chris from CRCS for your pledges given; you made a promise that day and kept it! Two special guests were with us that day to help cut the ribbon, Madeleine Frank and Quinton Abramson, representing the hundreds of children who have supported the new shelter through various fundraising efforts and donations. Young children to young adults have shown such compassion and caring for our animals, it is heartwarming.

First through the door, Claire and I carried the wooden urn containing the cremated remains of our animals that perished. They were placed lovingly in the memory corner beside a sunny window where they will remain forever. Leanne Perrier created a beautiful memorial with their names and pictures to hang on the wall above. Also, on the table are the urns containing our beloved Fred, the three legged shelter cat we had for many years, who died of cancer in April 2008 and Phoenix, our sweet little chow (terribly abused) who many of you will remember from the front pages of the papers in August 2009. He too died of cancer.



It was a fabulous day, everyone was ecstatic about our new home. People were coming and going all day. How nice it was to meet so many of our members and supporters.

The following week our animals came home with help of so many volunteers, Van loads of animals were transported and staff members settled them into their new surrounding. We were all home for Christmas!

There have been many adoptions since we opened as well as many animals coming in. People are enjoying just visiting or coming to walk the dogs or play with the cats. Our cat community rooms are great, the felines love their beds and perches and hiding places. All the dog kennels have a window to the outside and their own run and a bed to lie on, no more hard cement floors. Our little animals have their own room as well, every rat is enjoying his little hammock to lie in. The bunnies and guinea pigs are no longer hidden in a back corner.

We have geothermal heating and cooling and solar tubes to let in natural light. We are anxious to see our small trees and bushes in bud come the spring time. It would be nice to have a large "purple martin" condo put up on the property, I am sure there will be lots of mosquitoes for them to feed on. A bluebird house with a post! Our little trees are too small yet but eventually the birds will be able to nest in them! A couple of bird feeders, distlefink for the gold finches and black oil sunflower seed feeders for others. These will need a hook or stand as well. Just a few to welcome birds back to our area! If anyone is able to help out with these things, please call Karin at 905-665-7430 extension 223.

As well we are still planning our butterfly garden and community vegetable garden. Anyone who wishes to help with either of those, please call Karin at 905-665-7430 extension 223. The butterfly garden is selfexplanatory and the vegetable garden will be a few small sections of land for those of you who want to putter in the garden; plan a few veggies for yourself and share some with our little animals.

The shelter has been built with the help of our supporters, it is for all of you to enjoy and be proud of. Please come for a visit and see what you have helped to create. Read the engraved bricks in the front hall foyer. Watch with joy, the antics of the animals. Every bricks, every blade of grass; every bush is a dream come true and you are all a part of it!



Our new home is built *but* we still have funds to raise...

We managed to raise \$350,000 of our \$697,000. The federal and provincial governments each contributed their third. So we have to take a mortgage something we never wanted to do! Having to pay interest to a bank will just take away money from our animals. Please we still need your help to raise money to pay off the mortgage. The sooner we pay it off, the sooner it will truly be ours ...Buy a brick (see page 12) only 134 left ... we have installed over 450 so far. Shelter Numbers

Since we opened, our dog runs have been full and we have had to put small dogs in cages in the hall for brief periods of time. *Not including some of our animals in foster care, in the shelter we have 17 dogs, 67 cats, 11 rabbits, 20 rats, 6 guinea pigs, 54 birds and 2 potbelly pigs in foster care.* We also have at least five moms and kittens in foster care as well as other elderly or special needs cats and dogs. Everyone's waiting for their forever home.

Bunnies!

We have many sweet bunnies for adoption. A pregnant female was brought in with two other adult bunnies and now she has three of the cutest little babies. We will not adopt out bunnies prior to Easter – buy your children a chocolate rabbit – not a real bunny! After Easter, everyone tries to get rid of them. They are cute but like any other pet they require time, bunny proofing your home and a commitment from you. They are living, breathing feeling pets, not something disposable. They can make a wonderful pet but they are not a toy to be broken or discarded. If you are looking to adopt a rabbit we have many but as with a cat or dog, these little animals need you to love and care for them for the rest of their lives!

Birds, Birds & More Birds!

In January, there was a large rescue of 300 animals from a home in Fenelon Falls. We were asked if we could take some birds and cats to help ease the burden. We took in 10-12 cats and 127 birds. Our little interview room was immediately transformed into an aviary for the birds. An African grey parrot; (see story on page 9) lovebirds, cockatiels, finches, budgies, doves, parakeet and pygmy quails. We have had several adoptions but we still have several birds available including finches, budgies; doves; cockatiels and pygmy quails. These birds are just as important as every other animal in our shelter and it is gratifying to see them going from their former cramped, messy cages to new homes. We would love to see a few of the doves adopted!

Special Needs - Little Chester needs a forever home...

Chester – a sweet little love. He is a small-framed Staffordshire terrier cross, 9 years old who absolutely loves people – adults and children alike. He was left behind in a house when his owner moved out west. Fortunately, a neighbour called us and we were able to rescue this emaciated little boy! Chester loves to go for car rides – Claire Nicklin, our Vice President or Elizabeth, one of the staff try to take him for a ride everyday. After picking up a Timbit for him, Claire will go to the lake and sit for a while. Chester snuggles and sits and watches the waves with her. His sweet disposition will make him a perfect "only" pet in a home with people who just want a "snuggle pet". Chester would do very well in a home without other animals. He is not used to other pets and Elizabeth is working very hard to socialize him and he has come a long way! A visitor to the shelter yesterday remarked how he actually smiled when Claire entered his run! Chester is a wonderful, wonderful dog – please, if you have some love to give and want oodles of love in return, consider adopting Chester.

Special Foster Home Urgently Needed!

Little Aqua.

While walking one of our dogs, I found an emaciated frightened kitten on the lakefront trail in the woods near the footbridge and marsh near Camp X. She was absolutely starving and completely matted. We have had her to the vets and she was completely shaved down. Her little bottom and pads of her back paws are raw like 3rd degree burns. She has diarrhea since getting her food into her and her little meows of pain when she voids or has a bowel movement are heart wrenching. We have her on creams for her raw areas; medications for pain and some antibiotics and steroids.

All this little noodle wants is to be held and cuddled - she purrs constantly in your arms and kneads with her little front paws. She doesn't know what a litter box is and unfortunately has little stools in her cage. Oddly enough she often voids in her water dish! Perhaps she has food intolerance; we hope to try her on some special holistic foods to help her bowels. Once we can get the excoriated areas healed I'm sure she will feel so much better. She is in a large cage in a separate room from the other cats because of a current virus in the shelter. She desperately needs & craves constant love and attention.

I'm appealing for a very special Foster Home to take her in and help her on the road to recovery. If someone has time to spend with her: cuddle her; treat her wounds and just love her please call Karin at 905-665-7430 ext. 223 and leave a message. She would be better in a home without young children as she needs to be treated gently. We will supply her with a large cage and supplies until her stools are under control - she does love to come out for a little freedom and run around! But most of all she just wants to be held!

GIFT OF LIFE

So many of our animals have needed expensive veterinary attention. Animals requiring ligament repairs; tumor removals; amputations; eye infections; skin conditions and much more. Often animals have been brought in through our agent Leanna on weekends, requiring urgent emergency veterinary visits and stays. Unfortunately as I write this letter, we are in the midst of a deadly disease in a few of our cats – panleukopenia! Our vet costs will be exorbitant ... blood work; vet stays; intravenous; medications all in a desperate attempt to save the lives of our felines. Our staff is working very hard to keep things contained and bring our ill kitties back to good health so they can play and mingle with the others.

PLUTO – a cat with distemper as well as upper respiratory. After a few trips to the vet as well as the emergency vet, he recovered nicely and has since been adopted.

PATCHES – a sweet black and white cat had to have an eye removed due to an ulcer and has since been adopted.

GRACIE – a very, very sweet middle aged Staffordshire terrier who was dumped in a ditch in Courtice. She was emaciated and could barely stand. A good Samaritan found her and she came into our care. After a weekend stay in the emergency vet clinic, she spent some time in the foster home and was then happily adopted. You should see her now, she is beautiful and happy!

BUGSY – a bunny that came into the shelter with a very bad skin condition and mites that made him lose all of his fur. Unfortunately, Bugsy passed away!

LUCILLE – an 8 year old tortoise shell cat. She was a rescue from the house in Fenelon Falls that had over 300 animals. She required 8 teeth to be removed and now is waiting with a funny little grin to be adopted to a new loving family. She is currently in a foster home.

CASPER – a sweet little ferret found outside in the snow. Had a skin condition as well as a gland problem, has been happily adopted.

KADIN – a beautiful Husky who required crusiate ligament repair. Very sweet boy who has been on cage rest for the past month and a half, waiting anxiously for a new family to take him home.

HUEY – sweetie boxer lab cross. Had a tumor removed from his rectum and a leg repair as well. Loves to go for a walk and will be a wonderful boy in his new home!

PERCY – a senior Staffordshire terrier, approximately 14 years old, found wandering. He was skin and bones but ever so gentle and loving. He had problems walking and would urinate frequently. With some pain medication and antibiotics, Percy enjoyed the affection showered on him at the shelter. A couple came to adopt Gracie (see previous Gif of Life recipient) after reading about her in the paper. She was already spoken for and then they saw Percy. As they said, "Gracie brought us here for Percy!" He is so loved in his new home, sleeps on the bed; his coat is beautiful, loves their other dog and is absolutely loved in return by the whole family!

DOUG – a beautiful black cat rescued from a car engine. Sadly, he developed panleukopenia and despite veterinary care and all the love in the world, succumbed to his illness.

BIRDS – some of the 127 birds that we took from the home in Fenelon Falls had a skin condition. They were seen by a veterinarian and after four weeks of medications, are absolutely beautiful and healthy. Many have since been adopted.

We need your help folks ... our vet bills are very high but when you see a sick animal recover and go home, it is the most gratifying feeling in the world!

Cruelty Investigations at an Affiliated Humane Society

There are a lot of people that are unaware of the relationship that exists between Affiliated Humane Society's and the Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (OSPCA). In Ontario all Humane Society's are either owned and operated by the OSPCA, or like us, are an affiliate of the OSPCA. Being affiliated with the OSPCA allows the Humane Society of Durham Region to have animal cruelty investigators appointed under the OSPCA Act. The OSPCA Act is what gives our investigators the powers of the police to investigate allegations of animal cruelty.

Animal cruelty encompasses a wide variety of things, from failing to provide a proper doghouse for your dog to physically abusing an animal. Investigation work falls into two categories, education and enforcement. A great deal of our time is spent educating the public about animal cruelty laws. For example, some people might not be aware that an outdoor dog's doghouse must meet certain conditions in order to be considered 'proper'. In this example the person who owns the dog may not be being malice by not providing their dog with a 'proper' doghouse but was just ignorant of the rules governing doghouses. Investigators also investigate cases that involve extreme cases of physical abuse or neglect.

Before March 1st, 2009 the Criminal Code of Canada was the only animal cruelty laws OSPCA Investigators had to work with in Ontario. On March 1st changes to the OSPCA Act were proclaimed law. Prior to these changes the only offence in the OSPCA Act was failing to provide proper care for your animals' only if you were in the business of breeding and selling. It is now an offence for any person who owns or has custody of any animal to fail to provide the proper care. These standards of care are now regulations and are mandatory for everyone to follow. New offences are also added to the revised act. It is now an offence to cause or permit an animal to be in distress. It is an offence to interfere or obstruct an OSPCA Investigator while performing his or her duty. And it is now an offence to knowingly give a false report of animal cruelty to an OSPCA Investigator.
