## Who are we?

We are the only Humane Society (SPCA) in Durham Region. We are not a government organization and are not affiliated in any way with Animal control. We receive no tax dollars or government funding. We rely solely on donations from the public and money raised through fundraising events and adoptions. We are considered to be a NO KILL shelter, that is we only euthanize for terminal illness or for an animal that is considered to be a danger to the public (and in this case only after many attempts have been made to rehabilitate). We do not euthanize for length of stay. Our animals live in our care until they are adopted. All of our mature cats and dogs are spayed/neutered at our expense before being adopted.

Our mandate is to care for animals that have come through abuse, abandonment or neglect. Most of our animals come through our Animal Protections services (Investigation) department. Our officers are on the road constantly responding to calls about animals in distress.

The Humane Society of Durham Region is a registered charity and issues official tax receipts for donations. All donations are used solely for the animals here in Durham. We do not share our membership list with any other organizations.

The board of directors of the Humane Society of Durham Region is a volunteer group.

The Humane Society of Durham Region publishes a newsletter several times a year which is available to members. Membership is \$20 per year.
